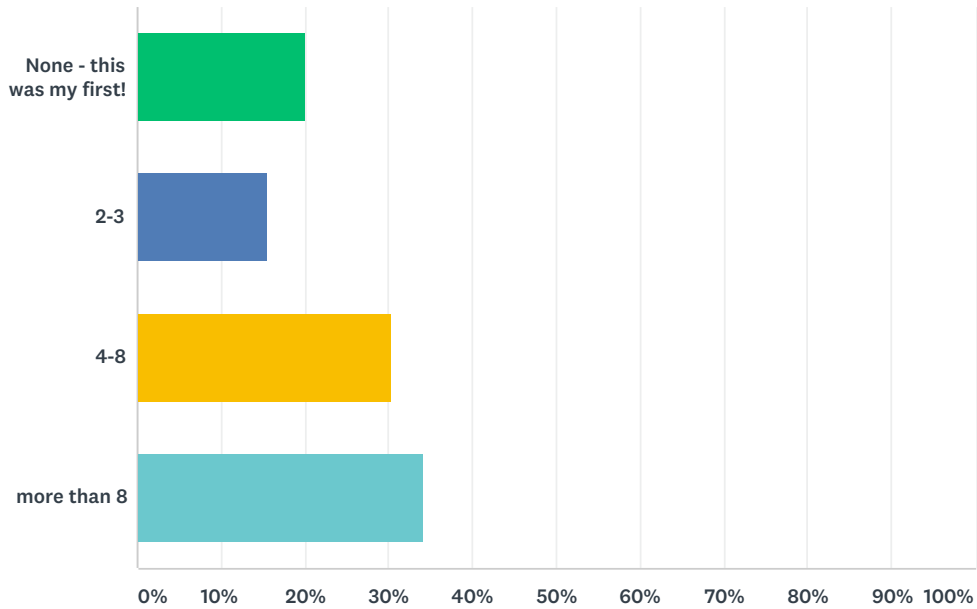


Q1 How many Cal-Nev-Ha Kiwanis District Conventions have you attended in the past?

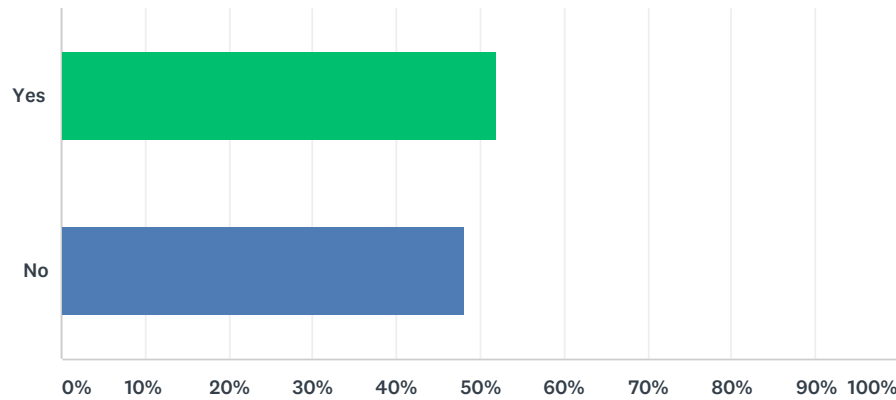

Q2 Did a spouse/partner/other guest attend the convention with you?

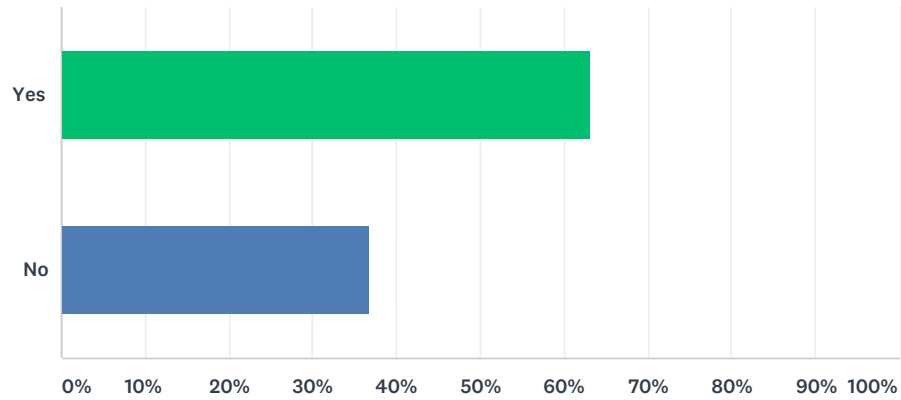

Q3 If yes, is your spouse/partner/guest who attended with you a Kiwanian?

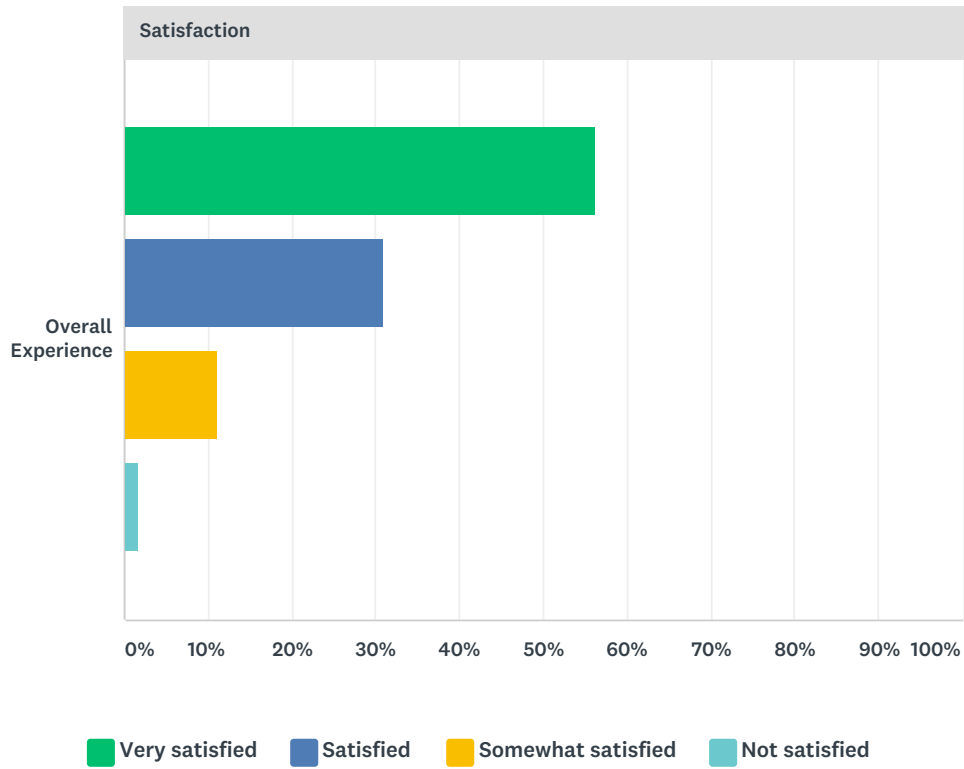
