DUTY: After one year of college, Ray convinced the Navy to send him to Electronics Technician school in San Francisco. His goal was to graduate from tech school and spend the next two years riding the bounding main, well, at least serving in a destroyer somewhere at sea. In electronics school, he specialized in shipboard radar repair, thus securing a place traveling “haze gray (ship color) and underway (at sea).” However, when he reported to Long Beach for assignment, there were about 300 men, including a young lad he went to high school with (he later was Ray’s Best Man) and a classmate from electronics school. Of this group, all went to ships (who cruised together) except for Ray! His friends went on a WestPac (Western Pacific) Cruise, and he went to Albuquerque (and that’s all he can talk about). Ray never saw an AN/SPS-10 radar in all his time on active duty. He continued his service in the Navy Reserve, finally retiring as a Chief Warrant Officer after 30 years of Non-Regular service.

WORK: Ray retired from the LAUSD in 2007, after 30 years in facilities management, about half on the maintenance side and about half in Public Works Contracts administration. His last assignment was to the Asbestos, Lead, and Mold office, as a Schools Facilities Planner/Assistant Project Manager.

PLAY: While he was in high school, Ray developed an interest in electronics and was President of the Ham Radio Club in his Senior year. He became licensed in 1981 and now holds a General Class Amateur Radio License. He also holds the General Class Radio Telephone commercial license which allows him to work on the transmitter equipment at an FCC licensed radio facility (commercial broadcast or public service, such as police/fire communications).
