I am the Caretaker and Herder for my farm and it's many animals. (2021-ongoing)

I carry and load 30+ pounds of hay bi-weekly and scoop 4 buckets of grain weekly for my 8 goats and 7 Jacob's sheep. I assisted my mother-sheep in the birth of three lambs, including bottle feeding, antibiotics application, and finding nutritional supplements.

I refill water and feed daily for 11 hens, 1 rooster; cleaning enclosures once a year. Raised 6 chicks. Pruning landscape and gardens, watering and establishing wooden supports for lemons, onions, and walnuts.

I feed my 200+ freshwater-catfish daily, maintaining algae/water levels through water pumps. During winter, I overlook 50+ of neighbor's goats, providing electric fencing/water.

In our fields worked on the watering systems and cut 5 acres of Hay for personal use every year.

Personal Statement*

From my experience as the single Asian in my Florida tennis-classes and my school's FFA-organization, I understand feeling like a new character in a show's 5th season. I've grappled with those internally helpless fears, of whether expressing my opinion and self would disrupt these groups' natural peace.

Key Club ice-breakers first shined my path for self-expression. When other members would ask my timid self if I knew the next step to the riddle, or when the past-Secretary begged me to teach him cursive for our

Shakespearean-insults, I was instilled with the belonging that I was important to others, because in these games, we could discard our social biases or standings just to lay our skills and ideas bare. It was a vibrantly casual environment, and I learned to freely provide my ideas/solutions when it helped my peers. This environment, where I was supported and included, empowered me to try competing for election, and my Key Club accepted me, as I was, into a role; where I could further be there for others just as they were for me.

Similarity-Clarity, or Egg-Chicken-Dinosaur. For over the course of two years, I have continued designing a corny game every club meeting to encourage (or force) our shy and outgoing members alike to come together. In coming up with a romantic story for a game, only a quiet sophomore's Webcomic ideals could put a romcom spin on her group's bear and fish relationship. Only a freshman-architect could reveal the influence of Barcelona architecture in our whiteboard Pokemon-art contest. By uniting them towards a specific goal, they find ways to contribute their perspective to our club in a way that no one else could. Prodding their interests in games to table-talks brought out the passions that made us tick, and formulated connections on surprising similarities, as we developed further appreciations of our interests under a new lens we adopted from each other.

And when I see their contributions to the club, I write them down as Secretary. I document every notable achievement of my fellow members in my report forms, from service hours to how they mustered the courage to speak up in our group-games, because these seemingly inconsequential incidents could be the steps they need to find the impact that only they can make in our club and school, just like those steps I needed guidance upon before. I use these notes of typed-words to let my members look back on how much they have done in a month to year, and encourage them to keep going further.

My first and foremost endeavor will be finding myself as the newcomer within the communities of college, as I explore worlds that have persisted for seasons, to years on end. However, from my experience as a newcomer to officer in Key Club, I'll know to wade for someone who also seems lost, unify to solve our shared confusion of where our next classes are, and continue to craft connections that flourish upon our differences.
